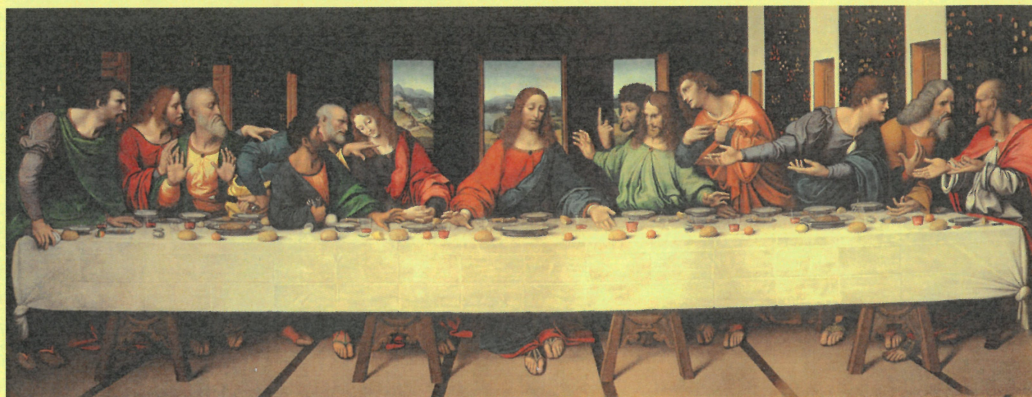
June 2: The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) Mark 14:12-16, 22-26

On this celebration of the Body and Blood of Christ, the gospel reading from Mark tells us about the Last Supper, that is, the final meal that Jesus ate with his followers. In it we hear that Jesus took bread, blessed and broke it and shared it with his disciples, saying, "Take it, this is my body..." He then took a cup of wine, gave thanks for it, and shared it with his followers. This special meal that he shared with his disciples is the basis of the Eucharist, the consecrated bread and wine that we share during Mass.

Do you have special meals with your family? What are you celebrating and what do you eat at these special meals? Are there certain foods that have become symbols of the special meal and reminds you of what you are celebrating? Name some of these special foods.

What are the symbols of the special meal Jesus celebrated with his disciples before he died? Do we share in those symbols? Where? What do they mean to you? What does "consecrated" mean?

Today's scriptures are Exodus 24:3-8; Psalm 116:12-18; Hebrews 9:11-15; Sequence; Mark 14:12-16, 22-26.

Corpus Christi in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC)

1356 If from the beginning Christians have celebrated the Eucharist and in a form whose substance has not changed despite the great diversity of times and liturgies, it is because we know ourselves to be bound by the command the Lord gave on the eve of his Passion: "Do this in remembrance of me."

1357 We carry out this command of the Lord by celebrating the *memorial of his sacrifice*. In so doing, we offer to the Father what he has himself given us: the gifts of his creation, bread and wine which, by the power of the Holy Spirit and by the words of Christ, have become the body and blood of Christ. Christ is thus really and mysteriously made *present*. 1358 We must therefore consider the Eucharist as: thanksgiving and praise to the Father; the sacrificial memorial of Christ and his Body; the presence of Christ by the power of his word and of his Spirit.

1406 Jesus said: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven; if any one eats of this bread, he will live for ever; . . . he who eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and . . . abides in me, and I in him" (Jn 6:51, 54, 56). 1412 The essential signs of the Eucharistic sacrament are wheat bread and grape wine, on which the blessing of the Holy Spirit is invoked and the priest pronounces the words of consecration spoken by Jesus during the Last Supper: "This is my body which will be given up for you. . . . This is the cup of my blood. . . ." 1413 By the consecration the transubstantiation of the bread and wine into the Body and Blood of Christ is brought about. Under the consecrated species of bread and wine Christ himself, living and glorious, is present in a true, real, and substantial manner: his Body and his Blood, with his soul and his divinity (cf. Council of Trent: DS 1640; 1651).
