Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mark 3:20-35

Today's readings remind us of two foundational aspects of our Christian Faith: 1) the sinfulness in our world comes ultimately from pursuing our own will and not God's will, and 2) God liberates us from our sinful condition through Our Redeemer, Our Lord Jesus Christ.

How do Adam and Eve refuse to take responsibility for what they have done?

How do you try to carry out God's will in your life?

Holy Father's Intentions for June

For migrants fleeing their homes

We pray that migrants fleeing from war or hunger, forced to undertake journeys full of danger and violence, find welcome and new opportunities in the countries that receive them.

Scriptures for the 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time are Ezek 17:22-24; Psalm 92:2-3,13-16; 2 Cor 5:6-10; Mark 4:26-34.

"Juneteenth" (June 19) commemorates the emancipation of enslaved African Americans in Texas in 1865. This marks the end of slavery in the confederate States. This is a Federal Holiday, and the office will be closed.

St. Anthony of Padua was a powerful and talented Franciscan preacher and teacher. He was a Priest and is a Doctor of the Church. He is known as the patron saint of lost and stolen articles, of the poor, of sailors and fishermen, of priests and travelers, a protector and guardian of the mails, and a wonder-worker. And he is the patron saint and namesake of our parish!
