June 23 Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Mark 4:35-41

Today's Gospel is from Mark. In it we hear how one evening, while Jesus and his disciples were near the lake, he said to them, "Let's go now to the other side." When they were crossing the lake, a bad storm came up, and a strong wind washed the waves over the side of the boat. Soon the boat was nearly filled with water. But Jesus was asleep on a pillow in the back of the boat. The disciples woke him and said, "Don't you care that we're going to drown?" So Jesus got up and commanded the wind and waves to stop, saying, "Be still! Be quiet!" Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Why are you afraid?" Don't you believe in me?" The disciples were shocked and amazed at what they had just seen Jesus do. They kept asking each other, "Who is this man? Even the wind and the water obey him!"

Have you ever experienced a bad storm? Were you afraid? Can you imagine how the disciples felt? Can you understand their fear? Share with others your experiences with fear. Was Jesus there for you? How?

Can you think of a time when you had a storm inside yourself (problems that worried you)? How would Jesus calm that kind of a storm? Why were the disciples amazed at what Jesus did? Would you have been amazed? Why or why not?

St. Anthony's Bread is often given as an offering to the poor in gratitude for St. Anthony's intercession. The story of St. Anthony's bread is based on a legend from 1263 when a young boy drowned near the Ba-

silica of St. Anthony during its construction in Padua. The boy's mother prayed to St. Anthony, asking him to intercede on her behalf for her child's life. She promised that if he was returned to life, she would give her son's weight in grain or corn to the poor. He was miraculously revived, and she followed through on her promise.

Many years later in 1888, the French baker Louise
Bouffier could not open her bakery. She called a locksmith, who could not open the door either and left to
find something to open it forcefully. Louise interceded
to St. Anthony until the locksmith returned, promising to give her bread to the poor if they could open the
door without force. On his return, the key miraculously opened the door and force was not needed. Louise
fulfilled her promise and gave bread to the poor in
Toulon. Others began to do the same in return for
prayers answered by St. Anthony, and in the 1890s,
the charity "St. Anthony's Bread was founded and is
now managed by the Franciscan Order.

June is the Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. It is also the month with the most solemn feasts or Solemnities. We have two solemnities yet to come.

Government officials continue asking Catholic Charities of Oregon to resettle more refugees in the Portland area, and furnishings

I for the new households are in short supply. "We have only one sofa left and a few tables," said Peter Vins of the Refugee Services program at Catholic Charities. Needed are couches, dressers, dining room tables, chairs, lamps, microwaves, used computers, kitchen supplies, cups, dishes and vacuum cleaners. Catholic Charities staff will arrange for pickup. "These families and individuals are fleeing the Taliban in Afghanistan, escaping persecution in Venezuela and seeking refuge from dangerous regimes in places like the Central African Republic," said Ed Langlois, spokesman for Catholic Charities. "A lot of these people risked their lives by working for American values." After a furniture drive in fall 2023, Catholic Charities was able to furnish 36 apartments for refugees. urkey and Syria are situated in a region that experiences frequent, major earthquakes. In early February 2023, central Turkey's most powerful earthquake since 1939 struck with a magnitude of 7.8. More than 10,000 aftershocks continued for weeks afterward, including a powerful magnitude 6.4 aftershock that struck the biblical city of Antioch, known as Antakya. More than 50,000 people in Turkey and neighboring Syria were killed by the initial earthquake, followed by more deaths and the destruction of structures damaged by the first earthquake. UN officials estimated that more than 1.5 million people were left homeless in what is believed to be the largest natural disaster in Turkey's history.

In a mid-February meeting with Turkey's new ambassador to the Holy See, Pope Francis asked what sort of aid Turkey most needed. Within 24 hours, Cardinal Konrad Krajewski, the papal almoner and prefect of the Vatican's Dicastery for the Service of Charity, organized a shipment of canned food, diapers, thermal garments, and other necessities, to be sent from Rome to a warehouse in Turkey for distribution to those in need. At the same time, economic aid to Syrian victims was entrusted to the apostolic nunciature in Syria. In addition to this material relief, the Vatican's prefect for the Dicastery for the Eastern Churches, Archbishop Claudio Gugerotti, visited Syria and Turkey to provide a ministry of presence to victims.

The Holy Father's charitable outreach to victims of war, migrants and refugees, the poor, and those affected by illness and natural disasters is supported by your contributions to the Peter's Pence Collection. When you
