Mark 6:7-13



In today's Gospel, Jesus sends the twelve apostles out in pairs and gives them authority over unclean spirits. He told them not to take anything with them except the clothes on their back and their sandals: no food, no sack, no money. They were to stay as guests wherever they were welcomed, and they were to leave any place where they were not welcomed, shaking the dust from their feet. So they went off and preached repentance, driving out many demons and curing the sick.

*If guests like these came to your door, how would you treat them? Would you turn them away? Why or why not? How hard do you think it was for the apostles to leave with just the clothes on their backs? Explain. How do you show Jesus that you welcome the message of repentance?*

Today's Scriptures are Amos 7:12-15; Psalm 85:9-14; Ephesians 1:3-14 or 1:3-10; Mark 6:7-13.

Optional Memorial of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel

The Church commemorates the founding of the Carmelite order on July 16, 1251. Our Lady appeared to St. Simon Stock on Mt. Carmel and gave to him the Carmelite habit. This is the origin of the practice of many Catholics wearing a scapular made with brown wool. Some Carmelite saints include:

St. Simon Stock (1165-1265)

St. Teresa of Avila (1515-1582)

St. John of the Cross (1542-1591)

St. Therese of Lisieux (1873-1897)

St. Teresa Benedicta of the Cross (Edith Stein) (1891-1942)

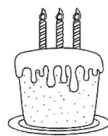
\*For participants without a Fred Meyer account:
