Mark 6:30-34


Today's Gospel tells about the apostles meeting with Jesus and reporting all they had done and taught. Jesus said to them, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while." People were coming and going in huge numbers and the apostles had no time to eat. So, they went off in a boat by themselves to a deserted place. But, people saw them leaving and hurried on foot to get to the other side before they arrived in their boat. Jesus got out of the boat and saw the vast crowd; he was moved to have pity for them, for they were like a sheep without a shepherd. So he began to teach them many things.

Jesus sees that the apostles are tired, and he wants them to take time for themselves and rest. When you are tired and have had a hard day, do you find rest in Jesus? How?

This reading tells us how Jesus sees a spiritual hunger in the people. What do you do when you want more information about your faith? Whom do you go to for answers?

<u>Today's Scriptures</u> are Jeremiah 23:1-6; Psalm 23:1-6; Ephesians 2:13-18; Mark 6:30-34.

Religious Education & Sacramental Preparation begin in September. Registration forms will be available the weekend of Aug 17 & 18. Our diocese has a policy that children are expected to have one year of Religious Education before preparing for First Reconciliation & First Communion. If you have a child in the 1st grade or another grade & you wish your child to receive First Reconciliation & First Communion next year, your child should be attending Religious Education this year. Be sure to sign up. Abp Sample lowered the age of Confirmation to include 7th graders thru high school. Contact Fr. Pat if you have any questions.

We will have a Memorial Mass for Barbara Mirasol on Thursday, August 1 at 11 am. The service will be something like a funeral but neither the body nor the cremated remains will be present. In addition to the Memorial Mass, there will also be a reception following the Mass. You are asked to sign up if you plan to attend the Mass/reception. Barbara, who died January 9, was an active member of our Parish.
