July 28 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time John 6:1-15

In this Gospel reading, John tells us that Jesus crosses the Sea of Galilee. The huge crowd of people follows him, because they had seen him healing the sick. Although he already knows what he is going to do, Jesus looks at all the people and asks Philip where they can buy enough food to feed them all. Philip replies that even two hundred days worth of wages would not be enough to buy food for everyone! Simon Peter tells Jesus that a boy has five loaves of bread and two fish, but it is hardly enough. Jesus takes the food and gives thanks to God for it. His disciples then pass the baskets of food among the crowd, telling them to take as much as they need. Everyone eats their fill, and there is more than enough for them all! The people see this miracle, and begin to say that Jesus must be "the Prophet, the one who was to come into the world."

What gifts do you have that God could use to help others?

If you had been the boy in this story, how do you think you would have felt, seeing what happened to your gifts?

<u>Today's Scriptures</u> are 2 Kings 4:42-44; Psalm 145:10-11, 15-18; Ephesians 4:1-6; John 6:1-15.

Bread of Life Discourse:

We are in Liturgical Year B, which means that most of the Sunday Gospels are from Mark. Mark is the shortest of the four Gospels. Those in the Vatican who designed our liturgies chose to insert the account of the Discourse on the Bread of Life (John 6:1-69) at this time of year. The Discourse on the Bread of Life begins today and continues through the month of August—a total of five Sundays. If we had continued the sequential reading of Mark's Gospel, we would have heard Mark's (first) account of the multiplication of loaves and fishes. The Synoptic Gospels' Multiplication of Loaves & Fishes are similar. Instead we hear an account from John on the multiplication of the loaves & fishes & a teaching from Jesus on the Eucharist. We skip Mark 6:35—56. When we resume Mark's gospel on the first Sunday in September (22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time), we begin reading from Mark 7:1.

Pastoral Guidelines

We suggest that the celebration of the Day - as usual - be structured around two fundamental elements: the celebration of a Eucharistic liturgy dedicated to the elderly, and the visitation of lonely elderly people within one's own community.

Visiting lonely elderly people

- In order for the message of closeness and consolation the message that the *Day* wants to express to reach everyone, including those who are most isolated, we suggest paying a visit to the lonely elderly people within one's own community and sharing the Holy Father's message with them.
- The visit, a tangible sign of the outgoing Church, is a way to reaffirm that the elderly, even the loneliest, are at the centre of our communities.
- The visit manifests the personal choice, following the example of the young Ruth, not to abandon anyone.
- The visit can be an opportunity to bring a gift, such as a flower, and to read the message and prayer of the *Day* together.
- The encounter between young and old, and the friendship that can arise, shows how the mercy of the Lord extends from generation to generation.
